In a workplace, management provides the leadership, vision, and resources needed to implement an effective safety and health program. Managers, we challenge you to show how you **Lead with Safety**. Identify a safety or health issue in your workplace and take steps to address it today!

- Identify a pressing safety or health issue in your workplace. Review logs of workplace injuries and illnesses, talk to employees, or conduct a safety walkaround to inform your selection. The issue you select should be specific, actionable, and important to workplace safety. Examples could include returning to the workplace during the COVID-19 pandemic, mental health, or roadway safety.
- Take one or more steps to address the issue in your workplace. This could include a implementing a new policy or procedure, providing a training program, or taking another action that will address the specific safety or health issue in your workplace. Be sure to provide sufficient resources to implement and maintain the action. OSHA provides resources on a variety of occupational health hazards at www.osha.gov/topics/

Importantly, share this coin with your workers during a safety meeting or training and post on your website, newsletter, or social media.
